November 14, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Helen Carson-Peterson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Jacobs opened the meeting in prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Session:

- Demolition Request (Harry C. Raysor Drive): Ms. Bronson the owner of the property on Harry C.
 Raysor Drive is requesting to have a portion of her building demolished. Ms. Warren informed
 Ms. Bronson she needed to provide the Town with the following information: 1. A formal
 written request to demolish a portion of the building. 2. Reasons why the building cannot be
 repaired and why it needs to be demolished. 3. Cost estimates for repair and/or demolition. 4.
 Plans for the space if demolition is approved. 5. Comprehensive Plan from a Contractor or
 Engineer on how the building will be demolished (i.e., Traffic Control, Encroachment, SCDOT
 permit.)
- 2. Demolition Beautification Project Applications: Demolition will come from the Penny Sales Tax and Council will decide the amount each applicant will be allotted. Mr. Jacobs suggested doing a second phase for the Demolition Project since the Town only received (14) applications. The Council members commented there need to be a stipulation clause that states homeowner need to maintain the property and have the grass cut for four (4) times a year. Ms. Warren will be sending out a bid requests to the Calhoun Times. The Council Members will review the applications and approve which property will be demolished after bids are received.

Mayor Carson – Peterson: John Felder apartments was nice with all the added additions. Ms. Bennett: The program at the Fire Department was for 911/Runners was very touching. Tri-County event Pig Pickening was very interesting. The Police Department movie night was excellent. Ms. Bennett talked with the Chief of Police on organizing a neighborhood watch group to make the neighborhood safe. 3. SC Youth Challenge- Deputy Director Ronnie Scott- He brought along with him Arthur Johnson and Von Libby who also works for the Agency. SC Job Challenge Academy is an opportunity for graduates of SCYCA (South Carolina Youth Challenge Academy) to further their success with vocational training and career readiness through partnerships with technical colleges. All programs are 100% free to the cadets through scholarships and will be completed in 5 months or less while the cadets reside at McCrady Training Center. The mission is to empower and prepare youth to develop personal, academic, and career success through education, mentoring, and training. The eligibility requirements are targeted toward 16-18 years old, males and females. They must be a high school dropout, a potential dropout, or has been expelled. The student must test drug free, not a convicted felon, nor under felony indictment. They also have to be physically and mentally capable of completing the program.
