Mayor Glover-Carson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Jacobs opened the Meeting in prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Glover-Carson entertained a motion to accept the prior Meeting Minutes. It was moved by Ms. Shuler-Guinyard and seconded by Ms. Riley. The motion was carried unanimously.

Mayor Glover-Carson entertained a motion to approve the Meeting Agenda. The Mayor requested to add an item under Executive Session to discuss Mr. Whetstone vs. the Town of St. Matthews. The Mayor entertained a motion to accept the request to add an item under Executive Session to discuss Mr. Whetstone vs. It was moved by Ms. Prickett and seconded by Ms. Shuler-Guinyard. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Mayor entertained a motion to accept the Police, Fire, and Animal Control Reports. It was moved by Ms. Shuler-Guinyard and seconded by Ms. Riley. The motion was carried unanimously. The Mayor acknowledged and welcomed those persons attending the Meeting.

Mayor and Council News

Recognition of Town Employees – The Mayor acknowledged the birthdays of Town Employees for August: Mr. Owens on August 25th and Ms. Shuler-Guinyard on August 26th.

Mr. Carroll expressed satisfaction with the positive developments in the Town.

Ms. Shuler-Guinyard shared her excitement about seeing the Town of St. Matthews featured in a booklet at the MASC Conference in Greenville, South Carolina. She noted the need for bush maintenance on Bridge Street near Huff Drive.

Mr. Jacobs raised concerns about overhanging trees on Calhoun Road and a sidewalk obstruction on Agnes Street. On Calhoun Road, there is a water leak near Ms. Billingslea's house.

The Mayor commended the Fire Department for the successful grand opening of the new fire station. She also mentioned an upcoming discussion on Facebook Live on September 5th, 2024, with Ms. Richburg from the Lower Savannah Council of Governments about senior citizens' benefits. For each month after that, she would like to provide seniors with valuable information. Ms. Prickett praised the Fire Department for the grand opening celebration and reflected positively on the MASC Conference, particularly a discussion on civility led by a youth counselor. Ms. Bennett congratulated the Fire Department on a job well done on the grand opening celebration. She also reported a pothole on Lower Muller Street that needs repair and

appreciated the quick response to a fallen tree in the same area. Ms. Bennett thanked everyone for the calls and prayers as she recovered from knee surgery.

Fire Department Update—The Fire Chief reported that the certificate of occupancy is expected to be issued by August 14, 2024. He expressed gratitude to the Council for their support in acquiring the new Fire Department and noted that the department has received nearly a million

dollars in grants.

New Business

2024-2025 Budget Ordinance – 1st Reading by Title Only: Ms. Warren informed the Council that she needed a vote on the 1st Reading by Title only, and there would be two budget work sessions. The Mayor entertained a motion to accept the 2024-2025 Budget Ordinance – 1st Reading by Title Only. It was moved by Ms. Prickett and seconded by Ms. Bennett. The motion was carried unanimously.

Mr. Jacobs informed Ms. Warren of a twenty-four-hour notice for Council members meetings, and he, along with Ms. Shuler-Guinyard, would like to be present when she meets with Dominion Energy.

Amendment to Nuisance Abatement Ordinance—1st Reading by Title Only—Ms. Warren informed the Council that she needs them to review the amendment on the last page, section 1244 item B, to determine the amount of the fine. The Mayor entertained a motion to accept the Amendment to the Nuisance Abatement Ordinance — 1st Reading by Title Only. It was moved by Mr. Jacobs and seconded by Ms. Prickett. The motion was carried unanimously.

Report of the Town Administrator

Police Department – Captain Britt reported that Cadet Darby will return to the academy on August 18, 2024, while Cadet Daye is scheduled to attend in thirty days. Cadet Ott will soon begin his four-week training.

Maintenance Department Report: Mr. Wilson reported that the Capital City Projects are near completion and that his department is behind in picking up yard debris.
